Elected representation



Yes, according to Article 16 of the Iraqi Private Education Code No.25 of 2016, the "College Council" is the college's highest governing body (academically and administratively). Our college council has 20 members; five of them are elected. The elected representatives of our academic staff (faculty members) attend all College Council meetings (12 times per year) and will be invited to other college events. The representatives of the academic staff are elected by all academic members annually. This role provides an opportunity to influence key college decisions and have real input into the college's direction and future.

In addition to that, the college recognizes the need to hear the students' opinions at every level in its decision-making. The students' representative on the Council has a crucial role to play in ensuring the students' voice is heard at the college's highest level of governance. The students' representative is expected to attend all council meetings (12 times per year) and will be invited to other college events, which they are encouraged to attend.

They are expected to read all of the council papers sent to them, keep up to date with changes and developments within the sector, while also staying aware of current issues within the student body.

The role of students' representative on the Council will provide the individual with an opportunity to develop a range of skills, including strategic thinking, consensus decision making, and intellectual prowess. They will build networks both internal and external to the college and further their understanding of the college, its responsibilities and challenges.
