

Possessive Adjective

- 1. He + she { is }

Countries

Abbreviations

- 1. He / she + is = he's/ she's
- 2. We/ they + are = we're/ they're
- 3. I + am = I'm
- 4. Name + is = name's
- 5. Where + is = where's

Pablo: Where are you from Ahmad?Ahmad: I'm from Egypt. Where are you from?Pablo: I'm from Spain. From Barcelona.


- His name's Kevin. He's from the United States.

Nouns and Adjectives

What is the difference between nouns and adjectives?

NOUN VERSUS ADJECTIVE

Noun is a word that identifies person, place, object or idea. Adjective is a word that modifies a noun.

Nouns can act as subjects or objects in a sentence.

Adjectives can act as modifiers.

Nouns can be found anywhere in a sentence. Adjectives can be found before or after a noun.

A noun can occur alone in a sentence. -----

An adjective cannot exist alone.
