Present simple tense

The present simple tense is used to express habits, general truth, repeated actions or unchanging situations, emotions and wishes.

- -He drinks coffee at breakfast.
- -She watches TV in the evening.
- -I go to work by bus.
- -The train arrives tomorrow.
- -Our meeting starts at 11 a.m.
- -His father arrives tomorrow.
- -Water freezes at zero degree.
- -The earth circles around the sun.
- -He will see you before he arrives.
- -He feels happy.

Principle rule:

Subject (S) + **Verb** (V)+

Note:

- -If the subject was single (He, She, It), add S third person singular.
- -If the subject was plural (I, You, We and They), use base verb.

They

She plays They play

He plays we play

It plays I play

- She goes to school daily.
- They go to school daily.
- He (give) me a flower. (simple present)

He gives me a flower.

- He went to the party yesterday. (simple present)
 He goes to the party.
- They English. (speak/speaks)

They speak English.

Negative in the present simple tense

We use auxiliary (do or does) in the Negative.

Subject + do /does + not + base verb.......

- If the subject was single (He, She, It), use does.
- If the subject was plural (I, You, We and They), use do.

$$\begin{bmatrix} I \\ You \\ We \end{bmatrix} + do \\ They \end{bmatrix} + do \\ He \\ It \end{bmatrix} + does$$

Note: Do not → Don't

Does not → Doesn't

- She enjoys playing the piano. (Negative)
 She doesn't enjoy playing the piano.
- The train...... (not leave) at 8 A.m. (present simple)

 The train doesn't leave at 8 A.m.
- I like finding out about other countries. (Negative)
 I don't like finding out about other countries.
- They doesn't take physical exercise in the evening. (correct)
 They don't take physical exercise in the evening.

Question in the present simple tense

-If the sentence starts with auxiliary, we use short answer with yes/no.

Do/ Does + Subject + base verb.....?

Answer:

Yes, + subject+ do/doed

No, + subject+ do/does + not

- Do you like swimming? (short answer)

Yes, I do.

- Does he like football? (short answer)

No, he does not.

- Do you come from Scotland?

No, I do not.

-If the sentence starts with Wh-q (who, what where, and how), we use short answer with yes/no.

Wh-q + do/ does + Subject + base verb.....?

- I live in <u>Iraq</u>. (Wh-q)

Where do you live?

- I like tennis. (Quastion use what)

What sports do you like?

- Ahmed drinks milk. (Wh- q question)

Who does drink milk?

- I speak two languages? (correct)

How many languages do you speak?

Adverbs of frequently

Always, often, usually, Generally, Sometimes, Never

We usually put these adverbs before verbs.

Subject +adverbs of frequently+ base verb......

- The sun always rises from the east.
- I never lie.
- I sometimes stay up late.
- I generally work after lunch.
- She usually goes to school by bus.
- He often eats cheeseburger on lunch.
- Peter (always come) to school early. (correct)

Peter always comes to school early.

- I drink coffee with my friends after work. (Adverbs of frequently)
 I usually drink coffee with my friends after work.
- We (not usually wake up) early. (correct)
 We don't usually wake up early.
- I work after lunch. (generally)
 I generally work after lunch.

-We can also use every+ (period of time):

every morning, every night, every week, every day, every month,.....
