### Pronouns take the place of nouns.


11110000	EVANNIE.

# SUBJECT PRONOUNS

- John is a doctor. <u>He</u> lives in London.
- Noun = SUBJECT of the verb.
- BEFORE the verb.







## **OBJECT PRONOUNS**



- Anna calls <u>John</u>. She invites him to a concert.
- Noun = object of the verb (the person who receives the action).

### **OBJECT PRONOUNS**

#### AFTER the verb.

#### I love HIM. (I love he)





### **OBJECT PRONOUNS**



#### • AFTER prepositions (*with, to, on, from*, etc.) Listen to <u>ME</u>!

#### He doesn't want to argue with THEM.
