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# PRONOUNS

I	me	my	mine
You	you	your	yours
He	him	his	his
She	her	her	hers
It	it	its	its
We	us	our	ours
You	you	your	yours
They	them	their	theirs

# WHAT ARE PRONOUNS?



- Pronouns take the place of nouns.

<i>Subject</i>	<i>Verb</i>	<i>Object</i>
I	see	them.
She	knows	me.
We	don't like	it.



# SUBJECT PRONOUNS



- John is a doctor. He lives in London.
- Noun = **SUBJECT** of the verb.
- **BEFORE** the verb.



**He** lives in London.



# OBJECT PRONOUNS

- Anna calls John. She invites **him** to a concert.
- Noun = **object** of the verb (the person who receives the action).



# OBJECT PRONOUNS

- **AFTER** the verb.

*I love **HIM**. (I love ~~he~~)*





# OBJECT PRONOUNS

- **AFTER** prepositions (*with, to, on, from, etc.*)

*Listen **to** ME!*

*He doesn't want to argue **with** **THEM**.*
