prepositions

At: used to indicate a specific location, time, direction, or relationship between elements in a sentence.

For example

I am at the park.

The meeting is at 3 o'clock .

I will see you at school.

IN

In: is a preposition used to indicate location within an enclosed space or something surrounded by boundaries.

For example:

He is sitting in the car. There's milk in the jug. He is waiting in the car. There's water in the bottle.

ON

ON : is a preposition used to indicate location or position in relation to a surface.

- The book is on the table.
- She placed her keys on the shelf.
- The cat is on the roof.
- She placed her phone on the desk.

Articles (A, An, The)

1-The :is known as the definite article and is used when the noun is specific or particular to both the speaker and the listener.

For example

- 1-I saw the black cat.
- 2-Pass me the white book.
- 3- The sun rises in the east and sets in the west.
- 4- The cat is sleeping on the mat.

2-A : is known as indefinite article and is used when the noun is nonspecific or general. it comes before words that begin with consonants.

1-A dog barked loudly in the distance.

- 2- A bird flew across the sky.
- 3- A car passed by quickly.

4-I need a pen.

An : is known as indefinite article and is used when the noun is nonspecific or general . It comes before words that start with a vowel sound.

- For example
- 1-An apple fell from the tree
- 2-She has an apple.
- 3- An umbrella protects you from the rain.
