Prepositions are essential for understanding time, place, and the relationship between words in sentences. When using prepositions, a noun or pronoun must come after them. The correct use of prepositions lies in understanding the context and meaning to be expressed. In this lesson, we will learn about the most important prepositions and their uses with examples.

- She works **in** an office.

- We will meet **in** the evening.
- The concert is **in** July.
- I was born **in** 1990

- The book is **on** the table.
- The picture is **on** the wall.

2- to express time:

- Do you have English lessons on Sunday?

- She was born on January 1st.

1- to express place:

- My friend lives at 42-oxford street.
- Ali is still at school.

2- to express time:

- I get up **at** 8 o'clock.
- Do you have English lessons **at** the weekend?

- I am going to the park.
- She sent a letter to her friend.

- They have been friends for many years.
