

Future Simple Tense

It is used to express an event that will happen in the future, as we can infer this time through some circumstances that refer to it : tomorrow, next week, next month, in the future

Forming the future tense/ The basic method consists of (will/shall +infinitive)

Where (will) used with all pronouns while (shall) is used with (I , We) just.

Positive and negative

Ali **will** play football tomorrow .

Ali (**will not or won't**) play football tomorrow.

Use:

1- Description of the Future:

The students will be at school at 8 a.m.

We'll be at the hotel until 8 p.m.

2- Forecasts and predictions:

I think I'll stay in this company until I retire

There will be a storm tomorrow.

3- To make an order:

Will you please get me my dress?

Will you bring some more water please?

Shall

1- For offers:

Shall I take you to school.

Shall we help you with your bags .

2- For suggestions:

It's hot . Shall I open the window?

Shall we go to the park later?

3- To express formal commitments:

Interested Candidates shall apply online.

Applicants shall provide evidence of their qualification.

4- Describing the future formally:

We shall overcome this difficult moment.

The president shall star his talk at 2 p.m.

1- I hope it (will rain - rain - rains) tomorrow.

2- I (see - will see - am seeing) you on Monday.

3- He (will give - give - gives) you the money tomorrow.

4- Wait! I (am driving – will drive – drive) you the station.
