Future Simple Tense

It is used to express an event that will happen in the future, as we can infer this time through some circumstances that refer to it: tomorrow, next week, next month, in the future

Forming the future tense/ The basic method consists of (will/shall +infinitive)
Where (will) used with all pronouns while (shall) is used with (I, We) just.

Positive and negative

Ali will play football tomorrow.

Ali (will not or won't) play football tomorrow.

1- For offers:

Shall I take you to school.

Shall we help you with your bags.

2- For suggestions:

It's hot . Shall I open the window?

Shall we go to the park later?

3- To express formal commitments:

Interested Candidates shall apply online.

Applicants shall provide evidence of their qualification.

4- Describing the future formally:

We shall overcome this difficult moment.

The president shall star his talk at 2 p.m.
