The Purpose of Punctuation

- Explanation: Punctuation marks serve various functions, including:
 - Clarifying meaning
 - Indicating pauses and intonation
 - Organizing and structuring sentences

Common Punctuation Marks

- Overview of common punctuation marks and their uses:
 - Period (.)
 - Comma (,)
 - Semicolon (;)

Examples of Punctuation Usage
