## **Present Tense**

## (Simple & Continuous)



We need to distinguish two basic types of present:

- 1) *Timeless:* expressed with simple present form:
  - I (always) write with a special pen when I sign my name.

As well as expressing habitual action. The timeless present is used for universal statements, such as:

- The sun *sets* in the middle of the galaxy.

Spiders have eight legs.





2) *Limited*: expressed with the present continuous/progressive:

- He *lives* in London but at the present he *is living* in Boston.

## **Notes:**

- \* Continuous = Progressive
- \* The verbs <u>keep (on)</u> & <u>go on</u> have a similar function to the normal progressive auxiliary (be).
  - 1- John keeps asking intelligent questions.
  - 2- John goes on asking intelligent questions.
